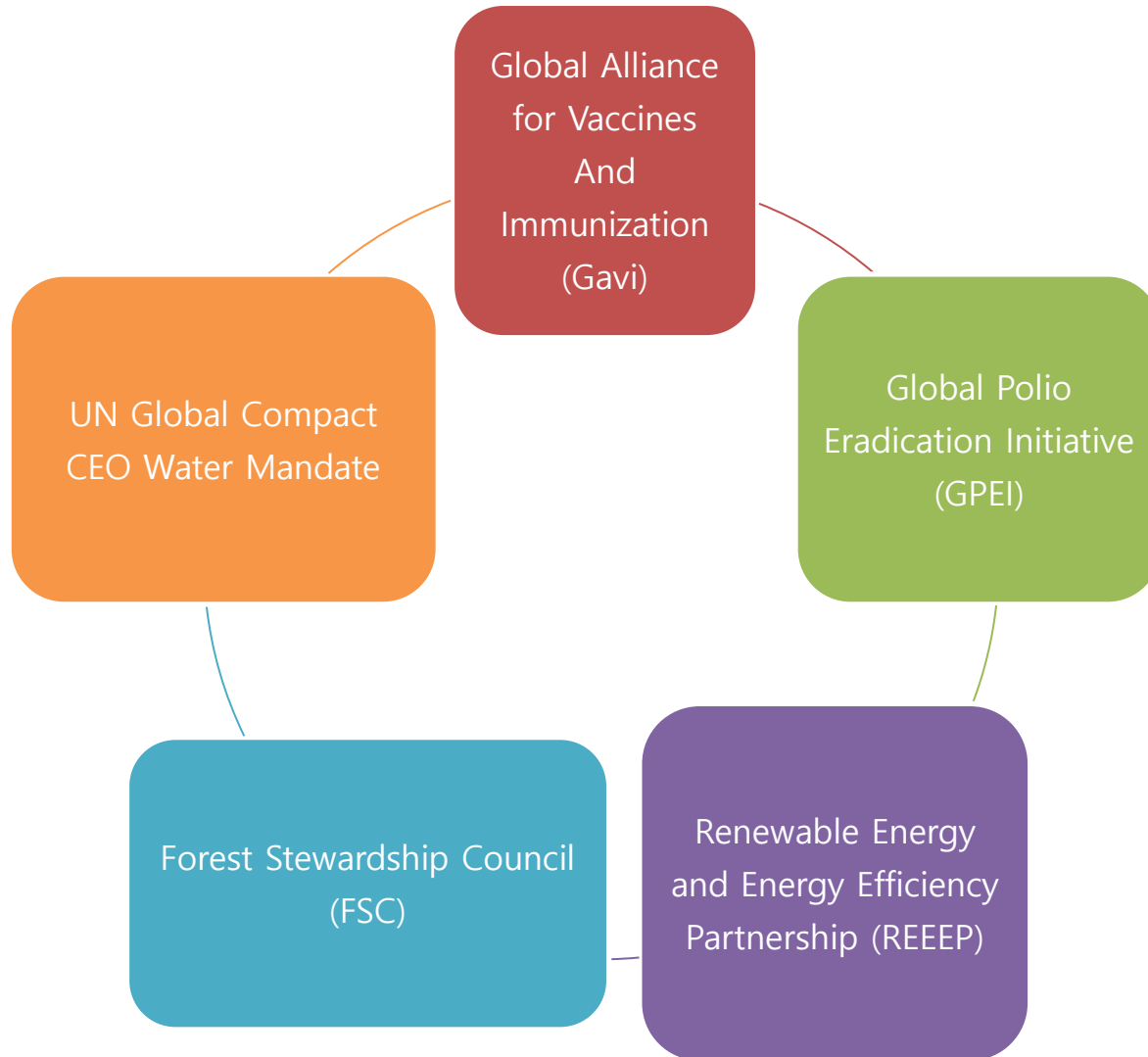

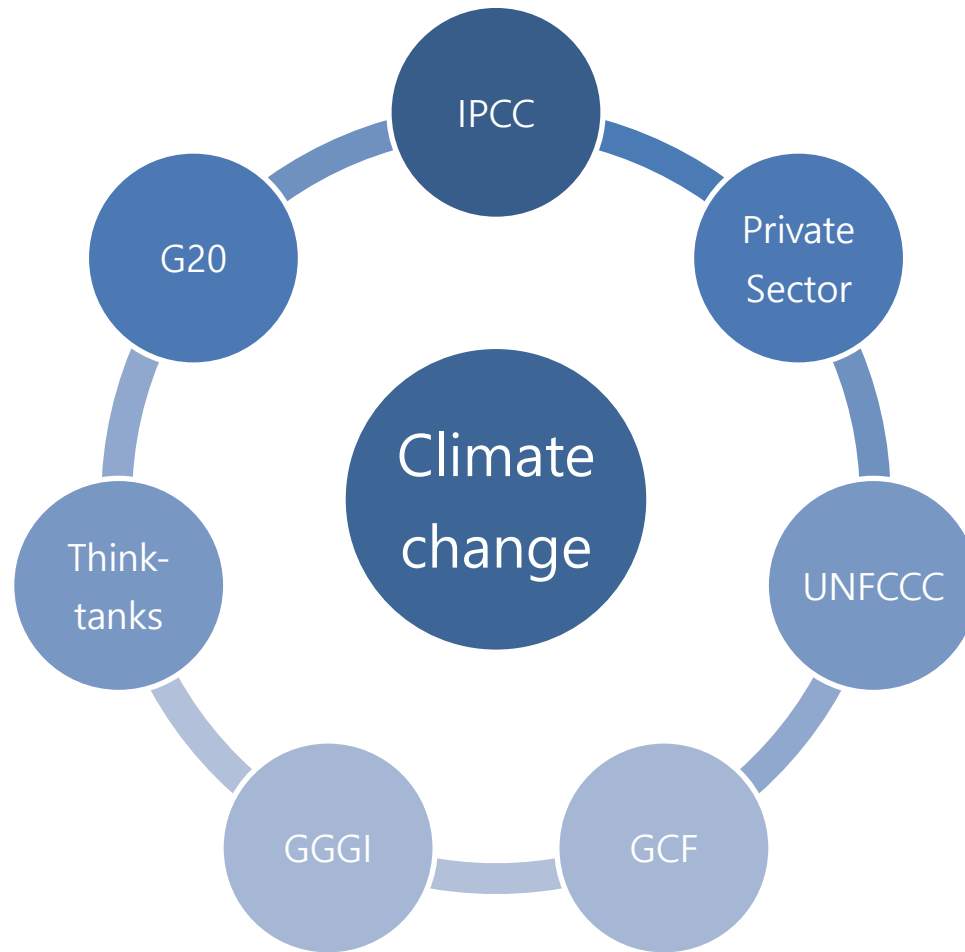

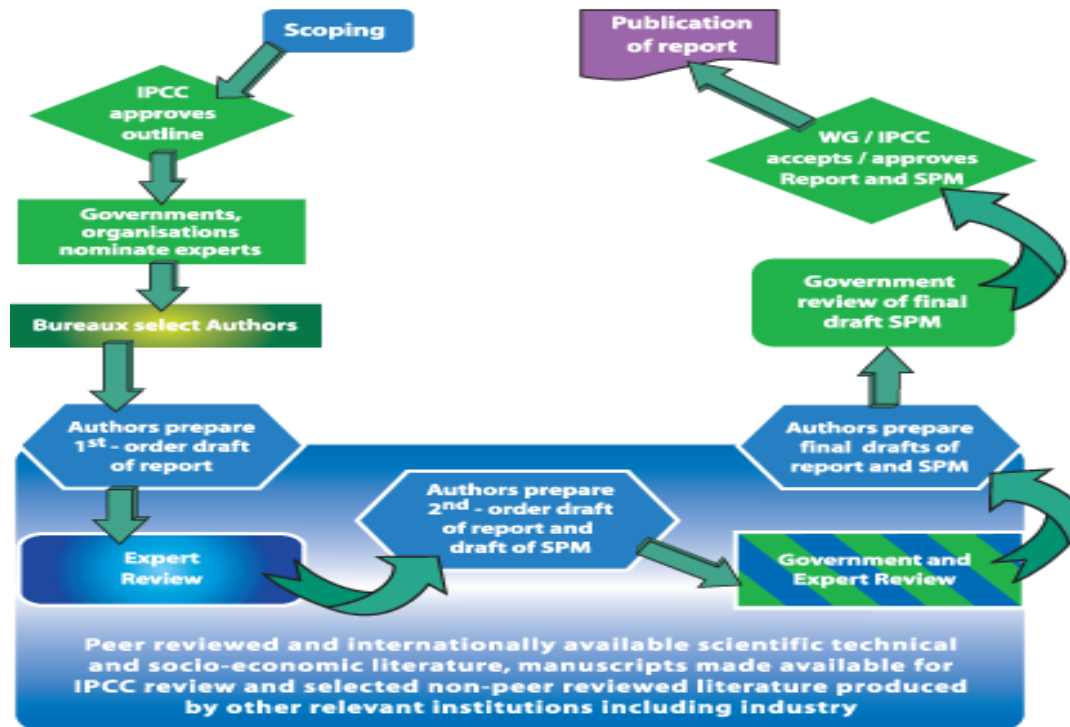
- Benefits

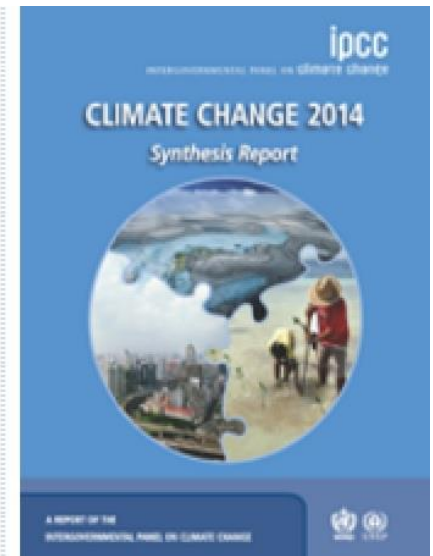
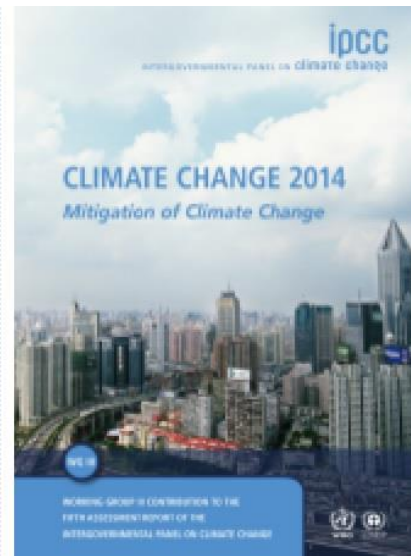
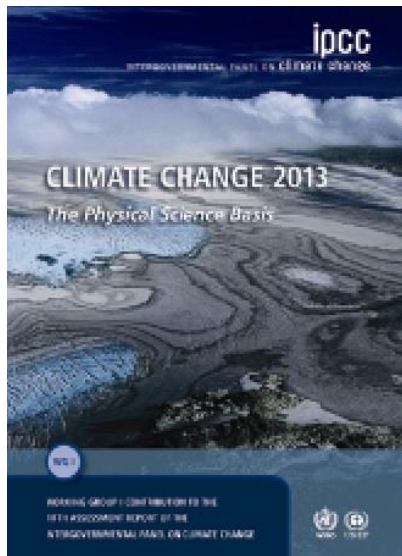


Role of IPCC

Importance of understanding on causes and impacts of climate change



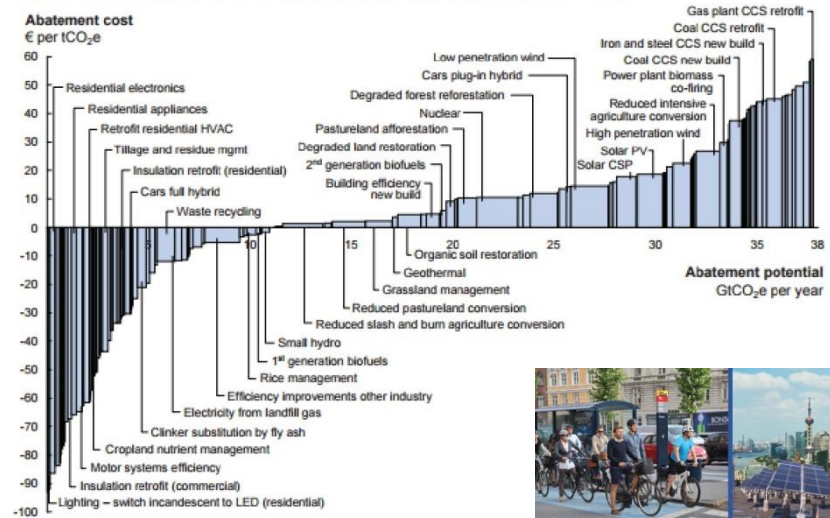
Science Cooperation between IPCC and UNFCCC



Science Cooperation on climate change

- Catalyst Project
 - To provide science based analysis to help UNFCCC negotiations process on Post 2012 climate change regime
 - Concept of Nationally Determined Mitigation Actions (NAMAs)
 - Long-term finance
- New Climate Economy
 - To promote science based understanding with strong political supports

Deep Decarbonization Pathways Project (DDPP)

- To identify pathways to deeply reducing GHGs in each country to limit global warming to 2 degree or below
- Conducted by a consortium between IDDRI and SDSN

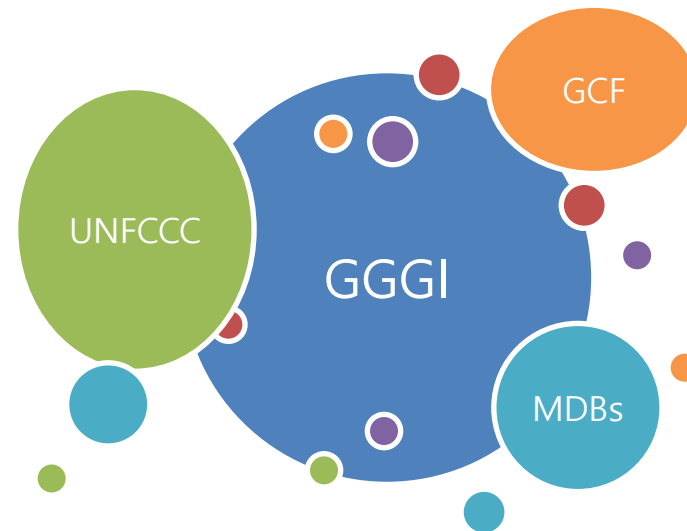


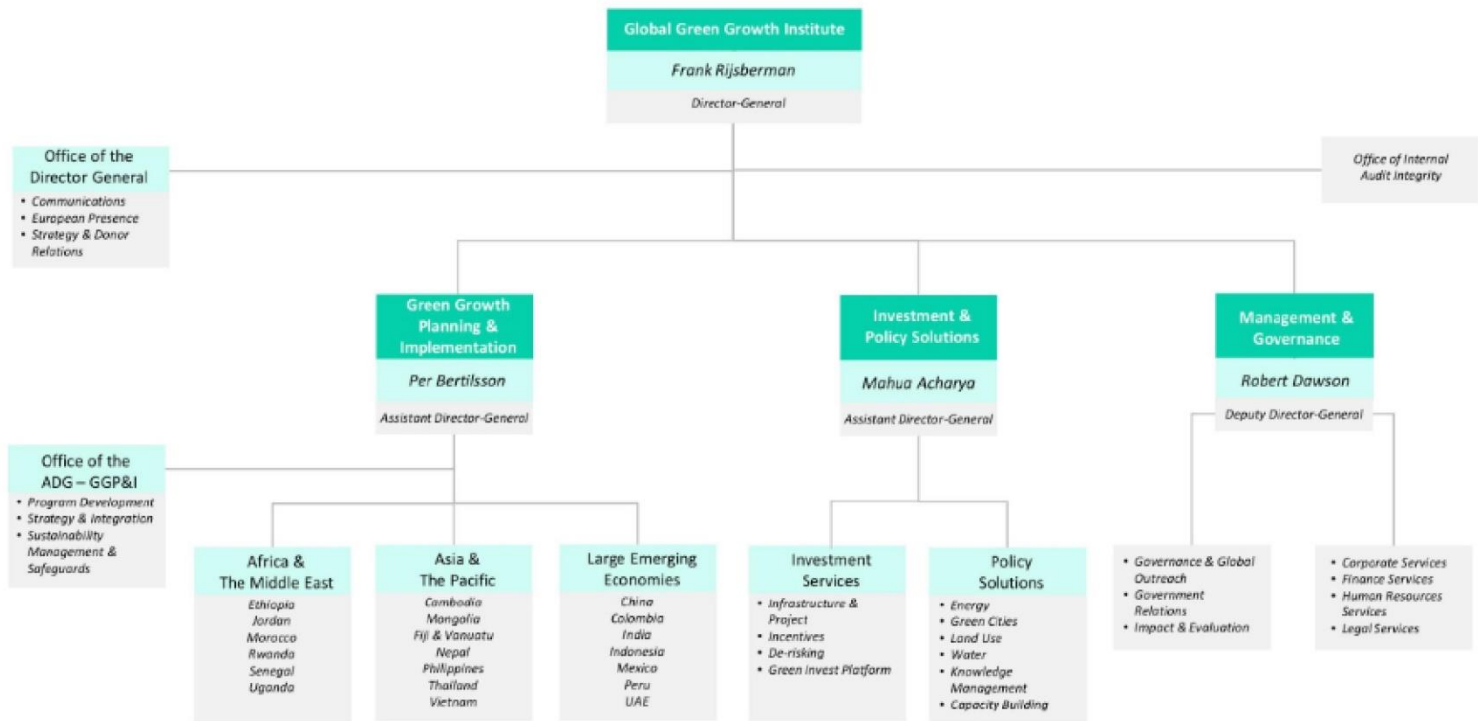
