Health and Migration: perspectives from Asia and Europe Public Talk Invitation

"Migration is a fact of life and governments face the challenge of integrating the health needs of migrants into national plans, policies and strategies" as reported by the World Health Organization (March 2010). With significant increase in population mobility between Asia and Europe, such challenges demand for a cross-regional systematic response involving multiple sectors through a multidisciplinary approach. Sharing of cross-border data and information on migrants' health, from source, transit to destination, is an integral part of this approach.

The Asia-Europe Foundation (ASEF) Public Health Network and Casa Asia will organise a Public Talk "Health and Migration: perspectives from Asia and Europe" to encourage an exchange of information, particularly addressing various social determinants that create an impact on migrants' health in Asia and Europe.

Dr Jaime F. Calderon Jr., Regional Migration Health Adviser, International Organization for Migration (IOM) and Dr Piroska Östlin, Programme Manager, Vulnerability and Health Programme, World Health Organization – Regional Office for Europe (WHO-EURO) will be the two eminent guest speakers for this Talk. During the event, they will share their insights into topics including various social determinants of migrants' health, multi-sectoral efforts to address migrants' health and recommendations for Asia–Europe collaboration on health and migration.

Speakers' presentations will be followed by an interactive session where participants including, representatives from national/international organisations, academia, public health practitioners, the diplomatic community and the media, will have the opportunity to share their experiences and directly interact with the speakers.
