Introduction

Education is the most powerful means to raise awareness and knowledge about pressing global challenges that concern sustainability, amongst them climate change and global warming, environmental degradation, or demographic changes. Therefore, for more than two decades, UNESCO has been promoting Education for Sustainable Development (ESD) to ensure that generations of today and tomorrow grow up with the mindset to value and practice the habit of living sustainably from an early age on. In the context of integrating ESD in formal education sectors, secondary-level education is considered as a crucial education stage to introduce ESD. This is because at this education level learners starts to develop relevant life skills, attitudes, and values that has long term impact in their adult lives. This means that to prepare future generations with mindsets required for sustainable lifestyles, teachers at the secondary education level bear a great responsibility.

The Thematic Training Session #1 on "Understanding Education for Sustainable Development (ESD)" is designed to help participants build a knowledge foundation on the origins and framework of ESD and identify its relevant concepts and initiatives. It will focus on the importance of ESD within the larger context of the UN Agenda 2030 and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), and its implications on education, especially at the secondary-level education. The session will also encourage participants to take part in team exercises to deepen their understanding and to reflect on their roles as educators to explore possibilities and challenges of implementing ESD in their classrooms/schools.
