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

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Dr. Yasmin is an educator of Applied Sciences with 20+ years of experience across academia and research. Her research spans plant genetic resistance, algal biotechnology for wastewater treatment, and public health (SDG-6) with 30+ peer-reviewed publications and supervision of 11 graduate students. As Principal Investigator, she has led projects on viral resistance, Agrobacterium-mediated transformation, and pharmaceutical impacts on aquatic microbiomes. Currently, she explores the convergence of biosciences and emerging technologies, developing AI- and blockchain-enhanced adaptive learning tools for neurodivergent learners, investigating AI's impact on student creativity and examining the disruptive role of AI in education. She also leads the AI for Lab Technicians series in Lablines magazine, advancing responsible AI use in laboratory science.

Dr. Jamal has held prominent roles in global conferences, including Inclusion Chair of IEEE RO-MAN 2023, Associate Editor of IEEE RO-MAN 2024-25, Workshop Organizer at ICSE (2022-25), and General Chair at ICIET. She is also the Founding Director of Bangladesh Flying Labs, Vice President of Bangladesh Open Source Network, Founder President of Bangladesh Robot Olympiad, and Central Committee Member of the International Robot Olympiad, where she advanced Bangladesh's global presence in STEM.
