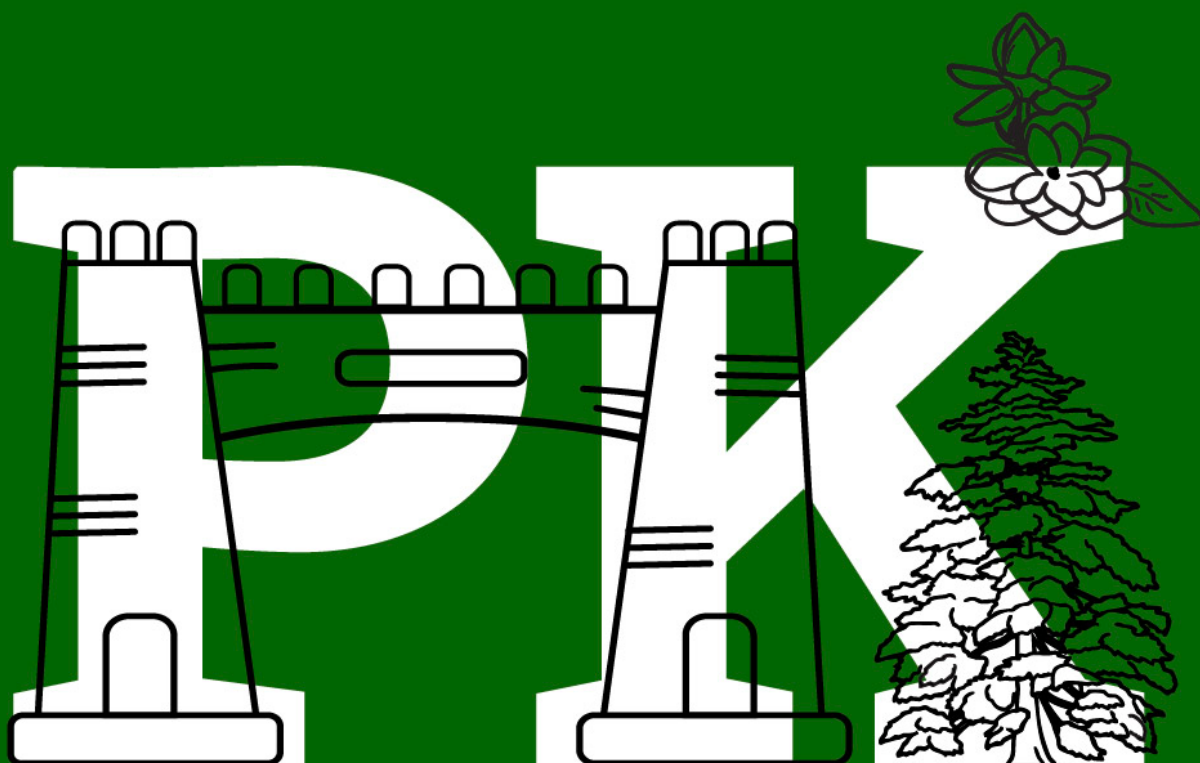

Background

The Mobility Funding Guide for Australia is a concrete output of the mapping of funding opportunities for international exchange in 20 countries in Asia. It was first released on culture360.ASEF.org in 2015 by the Asia-Europe Foundation (ASEF) with the cooperation of Arts Network Asia (ANA), Korea Arts Management Service (KAMS), Japan Center, Pacific Basin Arts Communication (PARC), and Yokohama International Performing Arts Meeting (formerly known as Tokyo Performing Arts Market, TPAM).

The main objective of this guide is to make available online the existing information on funding that supports the international mobility of artists and cultural operators from Asia, and to provide input to funders on how to fill in the existing funding gaps for international cultural exchange in Asia.

This guide follows the existing model of the *Guide to funding opportunities for the international mobility of artists and culture professionals in Europe* first produced by the Foundation Interarts, On the Move and PRACTICS.

This guide focuses on Asia (ASEM Asian member countries) and is organised around different themes, including culture and development.ⁱ

Only regular opportunities accessible online are listed when travels are at least partially funded for the selected candidates. Not included are: funds for which information is only available offline, funds that are not based on open calls, and ad hoc or short-term funding.

This guide is an attempt to gather all the resources in one document, and is by no means complete. As we aim to update it on a regular basis through further research and input from the field, your feedback is crucial. 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1. FOREIGN TRUST FUNDS, CULTURAL INSTITUTIONS AND FOUNDATIONS

1.1. British Council Pakistan

1.1.1. The Charles Wallace Visiting Fellowship Programme

Description

The Charles Wallace Visiting Fellowship Programme enables mid-career professionals across a broad range of disciplines to undertake short visits between two weeks and two months to the United Kingdom (UK) to broaden their professional knowledge, skills, and contacts.

Type of mobility

Residencies

Sectors

All

Eligibility criteria

Age: between 30 and 55 years

Nationality: Pakistan

Profession: Early to mid-career artists and Doctoral researchers

Other: Applicants who have studied in the UK/US/Canada/Australia/Europe/China in the last five years are not eligible to apply, nor are previous beneficiaries of Charles Wallace awards.

Destination: UK

Other priorities: Applicants should show a written invitation (for the period of time applied for) from a UK institution or arts body. High-level study and research as well as professional networking and exchanges with peers are encouraged during the fellowship.

1.2. German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD, Deutsche Akademische Austauschdienst)

1.2.1. DAAD Artists-in-Berlin Programme (Berliner Künstlerprogramm des DAAD)

Description

The programme offers artists time and space to focus on their creative practice without production obligations, enabling fellows to engage with Berlin's dynamic cultural scene, Germany's artistic networks, and diverse communities. Each year, around 20 internationally renowned artists in visual arts, literature, film, music, and sound are invited. Residencies last 12 months for visual arts, literature, and music, and six months for film.

Sectors

- ⇒ Visual arts (painting, sculpture, photography, installation, applied arts etc.)
- ⇒ Music/ Sound
- ⇒ Film
- ⇒ Literature

Eligibility criteria

Age: No upper age limit

Nationality: All (except German nationals)

Profession: Established individual artists and collectives (of up to three members) who have already developed their own voice and standing

Other: Doctoral students are eligible to receive support. Artists residing primarily in Germany are ineligible to apply, regardless of their nationality.

Destination: Berlin, Germany

Other priorities: Candidates in the visual arts category are nominated and selected by a specialist jury. The programme prioritises artists who critically engage with historical issues as well as contemporary discourses.

1.3. Henry Moore Foundation

1.3.1. Visiting Research Fellowships

Description

The Visiting Research Fellowships support artists, curators, and scholars with short-term residencies at the Henry Moore Institute in Leeds or Hertfordshire. Fellows gain access to the institute's sculpture archives, library, and collections. It is open to academics and curators researching historic or contemporary sculpture who can benefit from the institute's resources.

1.4. Maltfabrikken, Jutland Art Academy, Danish Art Workshops and Danish Foundation

1.4.1. Malt AIR

Description

Malt AIR, a collaboration between Maltfabrikken, the Jutland Art Academy, and Art Hub Copenhagen, supported by the Danish Arts Foundation, offers a three-month residency for professional international visual artists. Residents benefit from exchanges and connections to Denmark's contemporary visual art scene, supporting the individual's artistic research and practice.

Eligibility criteria

Age: No upper age limit

Nationality: All

Profession: Professional visual artists working outside of Denmark, who demonstrate exhibition experience within professional contexts, as well as former collaborations with curators on a professional level.

Other priorities: The programme prioritises prospective applicants who are keen on seeking new, reciprocal connections with the Danish visual arts scene, as part of their artistic practice and research.

1.5. Onassis Foundation

1.5.1. Onassis AiR

Description

Onassis AiR, the Artistic Research, Residency & Fellowship Programme of the Onassis Foundation, aims to foster artistic research and process by supporting arts professionals from diverse backgrounds and disciplines. Established in Athens, Greece in 2019, the programme provides space and time for creative practitioners to delve deeper into their practice without the pressure of presenting a final work.

Destination: Athens, Greece

Other priorities: The programme prioritises projects that foreground the exchange of ideas on current and urgent societal issues, rooted in the context of Athens and the global landscape.

- ⇒ Artist's fee
- ⇒ Other: Potential research/production networking and research trips budget

1.6. Rockefeller Foundation

1.6.1. Bellagio Center Residency Programme

Description

The Rockefeller Foundation's Bellagio Center Residency Programme offers up to four weeks of dedicated time for academics, artists, policymakers, and practitioners to advance specific projects at the Bellagio Center in Lake Como, Italy. The programme fosters a collaborative environment, bringing together professionals and practitioners from diverse disciplines and backgrounds to engage in meaningful exchange.

Eligibility criteria

Age: No upper age limit

Nationality: All

Profession: Artists and writers including but not limited to composers, fiction and non-fiction writers, playwrights, poets, video/filmmakers, dancers, musicians, and visual artists, who share the Foundation's mission of promoting the well-being of humanity and produce work that inspires change and action. University and think-tank based academics, scholars and practitioners from other disciplines and area of studies are welcome to apply.

Destination: Bellagio, Italy

Other priorities: Proposed projects can be based on any topic but must demonstrate clear social impact and charitable purpose. Applications that deliver novel solutions and approaches, as well as new knowledge and art that inspire change are encouraged.

2. ORGANISATIONS WITH A PARTICULAR FOCUS ON ASIA AND/OR SOUTHEAST ASIA

2.1. Asian Cultural Council (ACC)

2.1.1. ACC Fellowships and Grants

Description

The ACC fellowships and grants support international travel and cultural exchange for individual artists, cultural professionals, and organisations, specifically between Asia and the United States (US), and between Asian countries. The aim of the grants is to provide immersive exploration of other cultures, foster creative growth, and build international connections.

Eligibility criteria

Age: 21 years and above

Nationality: Pakistan, Bangladesh, Brunei Darussalam, Cambodia, China, India, Indonesia, Japan, Korea, Lao PDR, Malaysia, Mongolia, Myanmar, Philippines, Singapore, Thailand, Viet Nam and other Asian countries.

Profession: Arts or cultural organisation, or a scholar, practicing artist, or arts professional who can demonstrate at least five years of experience in one of the listed eligible disciplines on the website

Other: For applicants in the field of architecture, only proposals that emphasise design, aesthetic theory, and/or aesthetic history will be eligible. Projects with an economic, social, scientific, or technological focus are not eligible.

Destination: Asia and US

Other priorities: The ACC does not fund production-based grants, such as the creation of artwork or an exhibition, and instead seeks to prioritise process-driven activities such as research, cultural exchange and immersive experiences.

Grant coverage: The amount varies depending on the type of fellowship and by destination country. The grant funding can be used for:

2.2. Busan International Film Festival (BIFF)

2.2.1. CHANEL x BIFF Asian Film Academy

Description

The Asian Film Academy is designed to discover emerging Asian filmmakers, who will be selected to participate in short film production, workshops, mentoring, and masterclasses. The completed short films by the participants will be screened at the Busan International Film Festival. The programme also gives young talented film professionals from Asia the opportunity to meet established and experienced people from the industry.

Eligibility criteria

Age: 18 years and above

Nationality: Any Asian country

Profession: Film directors, producers, cinematographers, editors, production/sound designers

Other: Applicants should have worked on at least two short films, and should not have attended the Asian Film Academy previously.

2.3. Fukuoka Asian Art Museum (FAAM)

2.3.1. Residence Programme

Description

The FAAM invites Asian artists, researchers, and curators to participate in a residency programme with an emphasis on exchange with museum visitors and the local community, through collaborative art-making, workshops, and talks. The 60- to 90-day programme aims to enrich local culture and deepen the understanding of Asian arts and culture among the people of Fukuoka.

Age: Not specified

Nationality: Any Asian country

Profession: Artists, curators and researchers

Other: Applicants who are researchers are required to have a degree or experience, as well as long-term prospects, in the study of modern and contemporary Asian art. Applicants who are curators are required to be able to plan exhibitions in the same subjects.

Destination: Fukuoka, Japan

Grant coverage:

- ⇒ Cross-border travels
- ⇒ Accommodation
- ⇒ Other: Insurance, living expenses and expenses for art-making and art exchange programmes

2.4. The Toyota Foundation

2.4.1. International Grant Programme

Description

The Toyota Foundation's International Grant Programme focuses on deepening mutual understanding and knowledge-sharing between individuals from East Asia, Southeast Asia and South Asia countries, particularly those striving to find solutions to issues common to these countries. Grant proposals should outline efforts to carry out solutions, or aim to provide solutions, to these issues.

Nationality: Pakistan, including other East Asia, Southeast Asia and South Asia countries

Other: Projects can be either one or two years in duration

Destination: Pakistan, including other East Asia, Southeast Asia and South Asia countries as listed on the website

Other priorities: Project representative applying for the grant must have a contact address in Japan. Projects must involve at least two target countries. Proposals are expected to have four main characteristics: transnational (involve equal participation of members from two or more target countries in a target area); cross-sector (involve collaboration between different sectors such as academia, government, social, non-profit, etc.); mutual learning (involve exchange of knowledge and experience through direct interaction between participants); and foresight (must strive to expand the potential of future generations through innovative means).

2.5. Korea National University of Arts (K-Arts)

2.5.1. Art Major Asian plus (AMA+) Scholarship

Description

The programme aims to foster cultural exchange and spread Asian arts globally by supporting students to pursue degrees in the arts and cultural field. Open to students from various Asian countries, it covers fields like music, dance, theatre, and visual arts, enhancing cultural understanding and strengthening art education of developing countries.

Scholarships for further / postgraduate training courses

Sectors

- ⇒ Performing arts (theatre, dance, opera, circus, street arts, artistic creation in public space etc.)

Eligibility criteria

Age: Not specified

Nationality: Development Assistance Committee list of OECD assistance recipients, including Pakistan

Profession: Students who have completed or are expecting to complete their secondary education or Bachelor's degree programme prior to their application to K-Arts

Destination: South Korea

Grant coverage:

- ⇒ Cross-border travels between applicant's country and Korea for entrance and graduation
- ⇒ Monthly allowance
- ⇒ Other: Insurance, tuition coverage and Korean language training course

3. ORGANISATIONS WITH A PARTICULAR FOCUS ON EMERGING AND DEVELOPING COUNTRIES – COVERING SOME ASIAN COUNTRIES

3.1. Artlink-Office for Cultural Cooperation (Supported by the Swiss Agency for Development and Cooperation)

3.1.1. SüdKulturFonds

Description

SüdKulturFonds supports artists and cultural professionals from Africa, Latin America, Southeast and Southwest Asia, and non-EU Eastern Europe. It facilitates access to the Swiss cultural scene and professional networks, emphasising transdisciplinary projects and collaborations.

Type of mobility

- ⇒ Event participation grants

Sectors

Eligibility criteria

Age: Not specified

Nationality: Eligible countries identified by the Swiss Agency for Development and Cooperation, including Pakistan, amongst others

Profession: Artists and cultural practitioners

Destination: Switzerland and/or other neighboring countries

Other priorities: Priority is given to artists who are at the beginning of their artistic careers (between two to ten years) and are able to deliver projects that are of high artistic quality, professionalism and originality. It would also be ideal for the project to be transdisciplinary, whilst demonstrating equal cooperation, opportunity and diversity amongst all project participants involved in the project.

3.2. Goethe-Institut

3.2.1. International Music Projects in Germany

Description

The programme supports artists and ensembles from developing and transition countries, who are invited to take part in music projects in Germany.

Profession: Professional and amateur and newcomer musicians and ensembles

Other: An invitation and application from collaborators in Germany is a prerequisite for funding

Destination: Germany

Other priorities: The projects should include at least three events (concerts, workshops, panels, etc.) and should be of some cultural importance. Artistic exchange must be central to the project.

Grant coverage:

- ⇒ Remuneration
- ⇒ Production costs

3.3. Institute for Foreign Cultural Relations (ifa), Germany

3.3.1. Cross Culture Programme (CCP) Fellowships

Description

CCP Fellowships offers professionals committed to engage in two- to three-month fellowships, at host organisations in Germany or CCP partner countries, aiming to broaden their expertise, establish valuable networks, and enhance intercultural competencies. The programme focuses on strengthening civil society networks globally.

Eligibility criteria

Age: 23 years and above at the time of the application

Nationality: Pakistan and other developing and transition countries, as listed on the website

Profession: Those working in policy and society; media and culture; human rights and peace, sustainable development and climate justice.

Destination: Germany or other CCP partner countries

Other priorities: Applicants should possess at least two years of proven professional experience or volunteer work in a civil society organisation in their home country. Good written and spoken English skills are required. Applicants should demonstrate long-term social engagement and possess intercultural competencies

- ⇒ Visa fees
- ⇒ Monthly stipend
- ⇒ Other: Local transport

3.3.2. Cross Culture Programme (CCP) Synergy

Description

CCP Synergy promotes tandem cooperations between civil society organisations from Germany and one of the CCP partner countries to jointly develop initiatives and network sustainably.

Nationality: Pakistan and other developing and transition countries, as listed on the website

Profession: Those working in policy and society; media and culture; human rights and peace, sustainable development and climate justice.

Other: Individuals cannot apply for CCP Synergy

Destination: Germany or other CCP partner countries

Other priorities: CCP Synergy is aimed at employees from two organisations who are planning a joint initiative. One of the organisations must be located in Germany and the other in one of the partner countries listed on the website.

Grant coverage: The maximum grant amount is 4,500 Euros and covers the following expenses:

Eligibility criteria**Age:** Not specified**Nationality:** Countries on the DAC list including Pakistan (for projects in Germany), Germany (for projects in DAC countries)**Profession:** Artists, curators, art mediators, art theorists, architects, designers and institutions from the art and cultural spectrum**Destination:** Germany (for applicants who are citizens of and are currently based in any of the eligible countries on the DAC list) and countries on the DAC list (for German applicants and those who have lived in Germany for a minimum of five years)**Other priorities:** Cooperation between artistic and cultural workers from Germany and eligible countries in the DAC list should be a priority. An invitation from a non-commercial cultural or exhibition organisation (not a profit-oriented gallery) or an artist-in-residence establishment is required. Significant financial and/or other services provided by the foreign institution issuing the invitation is also necessary.**Grant coverage:**
