ASEF culture360's Launch and Roundtable on the Green Guide for Thailand

The Asia-Europe Foundation (ASEF) and Creative Migration jointly present the Green Guide for Thailand at Bangkok Climate Action Week 2026.

ASEF, through its arts and culture website culture360.ASEF.org, in collaboration with Creative Migration, is hosting the [launch of the Green Guide for Thailand](#) on **6 October 2026, from 4 to 6pm at Bangkok 1899**. The launch event will comprise a roundtable discussion to introduce the guide and the rich insights relating to the intersection of arts and environmental sustainability found within.

Researched by Creative Migration, the Green Guide for Thailand offers a snapshot of the country's cultural and environmental landscape, its creative interventions and on-the-ground challenges. The publication is the latest addition to the [Creative Responses to Sustainability](#) series, aimed at highlighting cultural initiatives that work at the nexus of arts and sustainability across the 51 Asia-Europe Meeting (ASEM) partner countries.

Creative Responses to Sustainability started in 2015, as a practical tool for cultural practitioners, professionals and policymakers, to assess the role of the arts and culture in responding to climate change and sustainability challenges. Eleven years later, the series is an evolving resource and has now grown into a repository of over 200 case studies and organisations across eleven countries in Asia and Europe, demonstrating the cultural sector's impact and potential in addressing some of today's most pressing environmental challenges.

Each Green Guide reveals the breadth and depth of how arts and cultural organisations across Asia and Europe are embedding sustainability within their artistic practices, and how they creatively engage with environmental issues. In addition, each guide provides a set of practical recommendations to support the sector in strengthening sustainable practices, policies and ways of working.

As the 12th guide in the series, the Green Guide for Thailand reiterates that more needs to be done for the environment and for sustainable development, and that is where the arts and cultural sector come in. To extend the impact of the guide, attendees will hear from a panel of speakers from featured local cultural organisations, whose work demonstrates the practical applications of sustainability, and the way it can be understood through the lens of artistic programmes.

The launch and roundtable event is presented as part of [Bangkok Climate Action Week \(BKKCAW\) 2026](#), a regional climate gathering taking place from 3 to 11 October 2026, that aims to shape a climate-safe future for Southeast Asia.
